This worksheet is designed to walk you through a simple process for sharing your story of faith. The purpose of this is for us to get to know you better and to allow you to reflect on what God has done in your life and is still doing. Our hope is that this will be a tool for reflection so that when someone else asks you about your Christian faith, you will be able to tell your story about how Jesus Christ entered into your life. About 1-2 paragraphs for each section below. Use the space below to write out your story. If you prefer, you may type out your story and attach it.

BEFORE + HOW + NOW = my faith journey story

BEFORE (your story prior to giving Jesus the leadership of your life)

Ideas: Tell how you thought, acted, felt; describe what you put your faith in other than God [work, money, dating, possessions, accomplishments, etc.]; tell about what you thought of Christians and church; or any-thing else that gives us a glimpse into your story prior to coming to know Jesus Christ.

HOW (the process of how/when Jesus entered your story)

Ideas: Describe how you got to the place where you recognized your need for Jesus; who told you about a personal relationship with Jesus and how long it took you to surrender the leadership of your life over to Jesus Christ; share what you did in order to become a Christian; what was your experience like immediately after accepting Jesus?

NOW (how God is at work in your life today)

Ideas: Explain how Jesus began to work in your story in the weeks and months or years after giving him your life; talk about the difficulties this commitment has made for your life; talk about whether or not you have shared your faith with others who are not Christians; what is different about your life now that you're a Christian's – Joys? Challenges? Fears? Passions?

Your Faith Story





Before people enter into meaningful Christian service, we have found it is helpful to first do some personal inventory regarding experiences, passions, natural abilities, and what we perceive to be spiritual gifts. This is why we ask you to take the following assessment.

There is often a correlation between Christian experiences and spiritual gifts. This assessment explores personal experiences that may indicate which specific gifts you are most and least likely to have. If you have not served before, then you will identify which of your behaviors most approximate those who have certain gifts.

Directions:

- 1. Read each statement in the following Experience Assessment (pp. 6-10).
- 2. Indicate how true of you each statement is by scoring it using the following scale: Score Meaning
 - 3 = Consistently / Definitely true
 - 2 = Most of the time / Usually true
 - 1 = Some of the time / Once in a while
 - 0 = Never / Not at all
- 3. Put your score (0,1,2, or 3) in the appropriately numbered box on the response sheet (p. 5).
- 4. Important:
 - Answer according to who you are, not who you would like to be or think you should be.
 - How true of you are these statements?
 - What has been your experience?
 - To what degree do these statements reflect your tendencies?
- 5. When you have completed the Experience Assessment, add up each column and record the total above each letter.

Administration

The gift of Administration is the divine enablement to understand what makes an organization function, and the special ability to plan and execute procedures that accomplish the goals of the ministry.

1 Corinthians 12:28, Acts 6:1-7, Exodus 18:13-26

Apostleship

The gift of Apostleship is the divine ability to start and oversee the development of new churches or ministry structures. 1 Corinthians 12:28-29, Ephesians 4:11-12, Romans 1:5, Acts 13:2-3

Craftsmanship

The gift of Craftsmanship is the divine enablement to creatively design and/or construct items to be used for ministry. *Exodus* 31:3,35:31-35, Acts 9:36-39, 2 Kings 22:5-6

Creative Communication

The gift of Creative Communication is the divine enablement to communicate God's truth through a variety of art forms. *Psalms 150:3-5, 2 Samuel 6:14-15, Mark 4:2,33*

Discernment

The gift of Discernment is the divine enablement to distinguish between truth and error. It is able to discern the spirits, differentiating between good and evil, right and wrong. *1 Corinthians 12:10, Acts 5:1-4, Matthew 16:21-23*

Encouragement

The gift of Encouragement is the divine enablement to present truth so as to strengthen, comfort, or urge to action those who are discouraged or wavering in their faith. *Romans* 12:8, Acts 11:22-24, Acts 15:30-32

Evangelism

The gift of Evangelism is the divine enablement to effectively communicate the gospel to unbelievers so they respond in faith and move toward discipleship. *Ephesians 4:11, Acts 8:26-40, Luke 19:1-10*

Faith

The gift of Faith is the divine enablement to act on God's promises with confidence and unwavering belief in God's ability to fulfill his purposes.

1 Corinthians 12:9, 13:2, Hebrews 11:1, Romans 4:18-21

Giving

The gift of Giving is the divine enablement to contribute money and resources to the work of the Lord with cheerfulness and liberality. People with this gift do not ask "How much money do I need to give to God?" but, "How much money do I need to live on?" *Romans* 12:8, 2 *Corinthians* 6:8, *Luke* 21:1-4

Helps

The gift of Helps is the divine enablement to accomplish practical and necessary tasks which free-up, support, and meet the needs of others.

1 Corinthians 12:28, Romans 12:7, Acts 6:1-4, Romans 16:1-2

Hospitality

The gift of Hospitality is the divine enablement to care for people by providing fellowship, food, and shelter.

1 Peter 4:9-10, Romans 12:13, Hebrews 13:1-2

Intercession

The gift of Intercession is the divine enablement to consistently pray on behalf of and or others, seeing frequent and specific results. *Romans* 8:26-27, *John* 17:9-26, 1 *Timothy* 2:1-2, *Colossians* 1:9-12, 4:12-13

Knowledge

The gift of Knowledge is the divine enablement to bring truth to the body through biblical insight. 1 Corinthians 12:8, Mark 2:6-8, John 1:45-50

Leadership

The gift of Leadership is the divine enablement to cast vision, motivate, and direct people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God. *Romans* 12:8, *Hebrews* 13:17, *Luke* 22:25-26

Mercy

The gift of Mercy is the divine enablement to cheerfully and practically help those who are suffering or are in need, compassion moved to action. *Romans* 12:8, *Matthew* 5:7, *Mark* 10:46-52, *Luke* 10:25-37

Prophecy

The gift of Prophecy is the divine enablement to reveal truth and proclaim it in a timely and relevant manner for understanding, correction, repentance, or edification. There may be immediate or future implications.

Romans 12:6, 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28, 13:2, 2 Peter 1:19-21

Shepherding

The gift of Shepherding is the divine enablement to nurture, care for, and guide people toward ongoing spiritual maturity and becoming like Christ. *Ephesians 4:11-12, 1 Peter 5:1-4, John 10:1-18*

Teaching

The gift of Teaching is the divine enablement to understand, clearly explain, and apply the word of God, causing greater Christ-likeness in the lives of listeners. *Romans* 12:7, 1 *Corinthians* 12:28-29, Acts 18:24-28, 2 *Timothy* 2:2

Wisdom

The gift of Wisdom is the divine enablement to apply spiritual truth effectively to meet a need in a specific situation. 1 Corinthians 12:8, James 3:13-18, 1 Corinthians 2:3-14, Jeremiah 9:23-24

The Evangelical Free Church of America is an association of autonomous churches united around these theological convictions:

God

We believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, and eternally existing in a loving unity of three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Having limitless knowledge and sovereign power, God has graciously purposed from eternity to redeem a people for Himself and to make all things new for His own glory.

The Bible

We believe that God has spoken in the Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, through the words of human authors. As the verbally inspired Word of God, the Bible is without error in the original writings, the complete revelation of His will for salvation, and the ultimate authority by which every realm of human knowledge and endeavor should be judged. Therefore, it is to be believed in all that it teaches, obeyed in all that it requires, and trusted in all that it promises.

The Human Condition

We believe that God created Adam and Eve in His image, but they sinned when tempted by Satan. In union with Adam, human beings are sinners by nature and by choice, alienated from God, and under His wrath. Only through God's saving work in Jesus Christ can we be rescued, reconciled and renewed.

Jesus Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ is God incarnate, fully God and fully man, one Person in two natures. Jesus—Israel's promised Messiah—was conceived through the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He lived a sinless life, was crucified under Pontius Pilate, arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father as our High Priest and Advocate.

The Work of Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ, as our representative and substitute, shed His blood on the cross as the perfect, all-sufficient sacrifice for our sins. His atoning death and victorious resurrection constitute the only ground for salvation.

The Holy Spirit

We believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He convicts the world of its guilt. He regenerates sinners, and in Him they are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service.

The Church

We believe that the true church comprises all who have been justified by God's grace through faith alone in Christ alone. They are united by the Holy Spirit in the body of Christ, of which He is the Head. The true church is manifest in local churches, whose membership should be composed only of believers. The Lord Jesus mandated two ordinances, baptism and the Lord's Supper, which visibly and tangibly express the gospel. Though they are not the means of salvation, when celebrated by the church in genuine faith, these ordinances confirm and nourish the believer.

Christian Living

We believe that God's justifying grace must not be separated from His sanctifying power and purpose. God commands us to love Him supremely and others sacrificially, and to live out our faith with care for one another, compassion toward the poor and justice for the oppressed. With God's Word, the Spirit's power, and fervent prayer in Christ's name, we are to combat the spiritual forces of evil. In obedience to Christ's commission, we are to make disciples among all people, always bearing witness to the gospel in word and deed.

Christ's Return

We believe in the personal, bodily and premillennial return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission.

Response and Eternal Destiny

We believe that God commands everyone everywhere to believe the gospel by turning to Him in repentance and receiving the Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that God will raise the dead bodily and judge the world, assigning the unbeliever to condemnation and eternal conscious punishment and the believer to eternal blessedness and joy with the Lord in the new heaven and the new earth, to the praise of His glorious grace. Amen.
